


## Supporting the communities where we live and work

Synergy has proudly been part of the Collie community for more than 50 years. We are committed to supporting the local community in which we live and operate.

Through Synergy's Collie Small Grants, we provide grants of up to \$5,000 to community organisations, charities, and not for profits, making a difference to the Collie community and helping to create a more vibrant place to live and visit. We recognise and value the diversity of the communities we are a part of and are committed to inclusion, fairness, and participation for all. We are looking for this shared commitment in our grant recipients.

Your grant application must meet the eligibility criteria outlined in these guidelines and align to one or more key themes.



### Where we operate

Synergy operates both thermal power stations and renewable electricity generation facilities from Coral Bay in the north, to Kalgoorlie in the east, and to Esperance in the south. Our area of operation is across the electricity network known as the South West Interconnected System or the SWIS.



### **Eligibility criteria**

To be eligible for a grant, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Your project, program, initiative or event must align to one or more of our key themes
- Your organisation must have an Australian Business Number (ABN)
- Hold an account with an Australian financial institution in the organisation's name, not an individual's name
- Be one of the following entity types:
  - a registered charity,
  - a not-for-profit,
  - or community group with an ABN
- Your initiative must aim to engage and strengthen the social, economic, and environmental factors of the Collie community
- Preference will be given to activities and organisations within the 6225 postcode
- Organisations may be located outside of Collie, if the project or activity relating to this grant is for the Collie community
- Applicant organisations must agree to have a representative available to attend the awards ceremony on the evening of 27 April 2023 in Collie, should they be successful in this funding round

#### Synergy will not support

- Retrospective projects
- Commercial organisations or activities
- Individuals or families
- Political or religious activities or pursuits
- Federal, state, or local government projects
- Maintenance and operational costs
- Organisations or initiatives that discriminate against origin, age, race, religion, gender, ability or diversity
- Organisations or initiatives that are environmentally negligent or do not endorse sustainable practices
- Organisations or activities that promote gaming, tobacco, alcohol, or drug-related sponsorships
- Activities that provide a financial benefit to Synergy employees or contractors
- Events, projects, or organisations that expose Synergy to known reputational, financial or safety risks
- Organisations or activities that do not reflect Synergy's corporate values of innovation, accountability, collaboration and trust
- Organisations that do not commit to acknowledge Synergy's grant publicly



# Preparing a winning application

When applying for funding, it is important to let us know who will benefit from your initiative (the beneficiary), how your initiative will make a difference (the impact) and how you will measure the outcomes.

You will be asked to demonstrate your initiative's intended outcomes and how they align to one or more of Synergy's key themes. We have tried to make this as simple as possible in the application form with free text and prepopulated fields. This information will also be required for the grant acquittal.

To accompany your application, you will need to attach relevant supporting documents:

- A letter with your organisation's contact details, ABN and payment account details on letterhead signed by the president, treasurer or secretary
- An image (hero image or brochure) representing your organisation and the activities you deliver as outlined in the grant application
- Quotes, operational plans, risk management plans, insurance documents related to the funded activity
- Marketing/promotional plans

You may also wish to include a letter of support to strengthen your application.

### Reporting and measuring success

In the application form applicants will be asked how the intend to measure the success of their project. Recipients must complete an acquittal form, which will include funds acquittal and an evaluation of your initiative's impact and return on investment.
