Small grants to give Collie projects big boost

Community-based organisations in Collie can receive a welcome funding boost to vital projects, through the latest round of Synergy's Collie Small Grants Program.

Synergy has invited applications for one-off grants of up to \$5,000 to support community initiatives, with projects aligning to its partnership pillars of innovation, education and community.

The grants will support projects aimed at strengthening social, economic and environmental factors of Collie's community.

Announcing the opening of applications, Synergy's General Manger Generation Dion Paunich said continuing to support local groups was an important part of Synergy's commitment to the Collie community.

The funds received by these organisations have been already put to good use, enhancing the services and valuable community programs they already provide in the region.

The Collie Cricket Club used their \$5,000 grant to upgrade their change room facilities, enabling it to offer women's cricket for the first time in its history.

Collie Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades will put the funds towards purchasing portable oxygen devices for their trucks and Allanson Primary School will use their grant to purchase a mini recycling station.

Not-for-profit and community groups can apply for the Collie Small Grants program before 9am, Monday 30th of March 2020.
